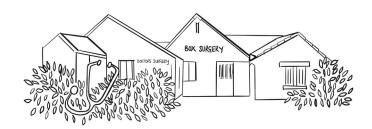

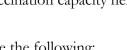

Flu and Covid Vaccinations

The winter season is approaching and we have booked our Flu and Covid Vaccination Clinics.

Please note that our clinics are now fully booked and we are unable to hold any further clinics due to vaccine stock. We aim to further increase our vaccination capacity next year.



To book your vaccine(s) please use the following:

If you are eligible and wish to book your Covid vaccine, please contact the National Booking Service who can arrange this for you: Book, change, or cancel a COVID-19 vaccination appointment online - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

If you wish to book a flu vaccine, please use the following link: <u>Book, change or</u> cancel a free NHS flu vaccination at a pharmacy - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

If you are booked into one of our Flu and/or Covid Vaccination Clinics, please ensure that you arrive on time for your appointment and are wearing a shortsleeved shirt/dress. If you are wearing a coat or jacket, please ensure this is removed prior to entering the clinical room. Please be aware that clinicians are required to draw up the Covid vaccination, this can sometimes cause a slight delay.

Please note that our car park can be extremely busy for such clinics.

If you wish to decline either vaccination, please contact the surgery via phone or email (boxsurgery@nhs.net) so we can update your records.

RSV Vaccination

If you are eligible for the RSV vaccination, you may receive a text message or communication from NHS England advising that you are eligible for the vaccination and to contact your GP surgery.

Please be assured that once we are booking clinics at the surgery, we will be contacting our eligible patients directly to arrange an appointment.

Please note that the eligibility for RSV is very specific, as directed by NHS England, if you are pregnant and aged between 75-79 then you will receive an invite. Unfortunately, if you do not fulfil these criteria then there is no facility to have this vaccination with the NHS.

Are your child's immunisations up to date? Current child generation illnesses are rising including Measles and Whooping cough. Check your child immunisation status and book an appointment if you need vaccinations - if they're not vaccinated, they're not protected.

As you may have noticed when attending the surgery, we are having some renovation work carried out in our reception and admin area. We have previously received feedback from patients that the reception space can appear "unwelcoming" and we hope the new changes will make our reception area more welcoming for patients and visitors. The changes include a new front desk space, from which our reception team can help patients and answer any queries you may have.

As a reminder, most people can use the online form on our website to submit medical or admin queries, which is often faster than waiting on hold or in queue. Of course, for those unable to use the online form, please call our reception team who are happy to help you.

Staff

Dr Rhoda Adu-Boafo has recently started at Box Surgery as an ST2.

Briony Gill also joined the practice at the beginning of October as a GP Assistant (GPA).

We are delighted that Dr Lucy James, who many of you will have met in the last year as our GP registrar, will be joining our team of salaried GPs in December.

Statistics

The waiting room does not always reflect how busy the surgery is. We offer many telephone consultations, with both our nursing team and GPs. Our duty team are always busy dealing with incoming triage requests through Patient Triage and also urgent telephone consultations.

In August 2024...

- We received 1,605 medical requests via Patient Triage and 295 admin requests.
- Reception took 3,904 incoming calls with the average queue time being 2 minutes and 56 seconds.
- Our clinical and reception team combined completed 3,369 outbound calls.
- 3,655 appointments were attended, 1,224 of those appointments being telephone calls.
- Unfortunately 124 people were unable to attend their booked appointments and failed to inform the surgery which reduces our capacity to offer appointments to other patients who need them. Please always inform us if you can no longer make an appointment thank you.

Patient Feedback

After attending for certain appointments in the surgery, you will receive a text message with a link to complete a Family & Friends Test (FFT). This is a contractual requirement that all GP practices undertake and the first two questions are set by NHS England.

If you receive this message, please complete it where possible as this is a great way of obtaining feedback from our patients.

Hospital Medication Changes

If a doctor or other clinician in hospital has advised a change to your medication, please allow 14 days before contacting the surgery to obtain this. If the medication is required within 14 days, it should be provided by your specialist so please contact them directly. Upon discharge from hospital, you should be given at least a 14-day supply of your regular medication. In exceptional circumstances when urgent medication changes are required, we must have a written request from your specialist.
